



Greenergy focuses on social impact with an investment of approximately one million euros

In 2020, it will invest more than 600,000 euros in environmental protection measures

In its annual report, Greenergy explains its support for local communities

Madrid, May 17, 2020- Greenergy, the Spanish company that produces energy from renewable sources, invested in 2020 more than 869,000 euros in social and environmental impact measures in the communities where it operates, according to the sustainability report it has presented to the market.

In addition, in a year particularly marked by the coronavirus pandemic, it used its international logistics infrastructure to import and distribute COVID protection equipment in Spain and in the Latin American countries where it operates, such as Chile, Argentina and Colombia; a donation of health material that exceeded €250,000 and included more than 400,000 masks among other equipment.

The material was intended to protect, on the one hand, the most exposed frontline groups such as health personnel, firefighters and Red Cross in various countries and, on the other hand, the most vulnerable local communities in the area surrounding its projects, all at a time of growing demand and shortage of this equipment.

Commitment to the development of local communities

The company seeks opportunities to create social impact in the local community near its projects, according to the needs of each area. For example, in Peru it will allocate 1% of its annual income to the development of the local community, while in Argentina it has launched a university scholarship to support local young people from the community to study renewable energy. On the other hand, the basic needs detected in the population near its solar plant in Chile have led Greenergy to make a commitment to electrify the local community of Quillagua.

Located in the heart of the Atacama Desert, Quillagua is the driest inhabited area in the world, where the company has built one of its largest solar parks to date and has undertaken to install a 350 KW photovoltaic plant to supply electricity to the population, which currently has limited access from a diesel generator, as well as other initiatives aimed at supporting local tourism and protecting the cultural heritage.

Greenergy is also committed to people and talent. Proof of this is the certification obtained from Great Place to Work in 2020, a recognition based on the trust and level of satisfaction of its employees, creating more than 1,300 jobs in 2020 for the construction of its renewable energy projects.

According to María Rodríguez Gismero, Sustainability Director at Greenergy, "The social part of ESG is becoming more and more relevant and the pandemic has made us prioritize it even more" Likewise, "Our goal is to create real social impact among the local community of our projects. In 2020, we have focused our efforts on protection against COVID but we have also made progress with other local development commitments as we state in our Report."
